- the organisation is undertaking internal interviews to determine the most suitable applicant or
- the organisation is planning a long term strategy for workforce development and wishes to make an application for a future cohort

This information will need to be completed and, where possible, submitted 1 week prior to the selection day. The organisation must complete part 3 and ensure the trainee that is appointed/selected to apply meets the requirements set out in part 1.

Application support

This section is to be completed by your line manager, relevant clinical supervisor/ lead and mentor. In order to apply for the programme each trainee is required to have backing from their service.

The programme is a 30- week blended learning programme comprising a number of elements, including formal teaching, online learning, the submission of an academic assignment, and completion of the HEE competence portfolio. A further key aspect of the programme is that trainees will need to be supported by their employing trust to complete JAG Certification within the 30 weeks timeframe with a minimum of two dedicated training lists per week. Following completion, a minimum of one service list a week is required. It is important that you understand this expectation and are able to support this application.

Applicants are selected to undertake this training will be expected to work in their employing organisation's endoscopy unit for two years after completing this programme or will be asked to refund all or some of the costs of their training. If the applicant is selected for training, an addendum to their local contract will be issued with a formal Learning Agreement before they start the programme.

The Clinical Supervisor must be a Consultant Grade Doctor meeting JAG Training The Trainer Requirements.

Health Education England governance for this programme and final competence sign off requires the Clinical Supervisor to be a Consultant Grade Doctor registered with the GMC. The Clinical Supervisor cannot delegate the responsibilities of the role or endoscopy training to another person, and act only as a distant or nominated supervisor.

This is an accelerated training programme, leading to independent advanced clinical practice within thirty weeks. The Clinical Supervisor is therefore required to undertake around 50% of the training lists with the trainee, maximising learning opportunities for endoscopic and non technical endoscopic skills, pathophysiology, pharmacology, GI disease, co morbidity and complications, and clinical decision making. Organisations may choose to job share this role between two consultants, and provide additional supportive lists with other medical or nurse endoscopists.

A senior nurse will also be required to act as mentor throughout the programme.

Each trainee participating in the programme must nominate a senior nurse mentor. This should be a senior, experienced nurse endoscopist, a senior advanced practice nurse, or a directorate level nurse. They must have mentorship experience at advanced practice level. Their role will be to support and facilitate your development to become a Clinical Endoscopist.
