



JAG accreditation standards update for UK services

We recommend that you review each individual standard when uploading evidence.

Main differences between the previous GRS standards (released in 2021, updated in 2024) and the 2025 JAG accreditation standards:

- > Decreased domains. In the old standards there were 19 domains, now there are **11**.
- > Decreased number of individual standards. The old GRS standards had 133, the new version has **80**.
- > Reduced duplication while retaining the same **high quality**.
- > GRS **levels have been removed** and will no longer be recorded as A, B or C. You now either meet the standard or you don't.
- > Updated **PEUGIC** and **PCCRC** guidance.
- > Services must now show that **25%** of all healthcare staff involved in the endoscopy pathway or assisting with procedures have completed the JETS Workforce ENDO1 training and the required e-learning modules. This replaces the previous 10% requirement.
- > All surveillance procedures are now expected to be clinically validated at least **3 months** before the due date according to national guidance. The previous expectation was 2 months.
- > Standard 3.7 regarding acute upper and lower GI bleeding has a new evidence requirement that requires **a new audit**.
- > There are some new **SOP** requirements for evidence.
- > The new domain **person-centred care** both streamlines and improves the focus on the patient.
